ORDER

(DATE OF HEARING: 01.04.2025)

- 1. The Petitioner, M/s Prayan Ispat & Steel Pvt. Ltd., having an industrial unit in the area of Pashchimanchal Vidyut Vitran Nigam Ltd. (PVVNL), has referred to Annexure 6.5 (mentioned in clause 6.16) of the Uttar Pradesh Electricity Supply Code 2005 (hereinafter referred to as Supply Code) which is in regard to the revival of industrial units that are lying disconnected for more than six months.
- 2. The Petitioner has submitted that Annexure 6.5 was the Order of Commission in the matter of Regulation for industrial units under Sick Industrial Companies (Special Provisions) Act, 1985, which has now been repealed by the Sick Industrial Companies (Special Provisions) Repeal Act, 2003 from 01.12.2016. The Petitioner has also submitted that as per the UP Industrial Policy 2012, the rehabilitation of sick unit is to be considered by the UP Small Industrial Unit Rehabilitation Board.
- 3. In light of the changes that have taken place, as mentioned in para 2 above, the benefits that were granted under Annexure 6.5 of the Supply Code will no longer be available. The Petitioner has therefore made a prayer to pass appropriate Order so that earlier provision of Annexure 6.5 of the UP Electricity Supply code, which has become redundant, becomes available to the Petitioner's unit. It is further submitted by the Petitioner that the electricity connection of its unit remained disconnected from 04.07.2023 to 28.02.2025.
- 4. The Commission observed that as per the submissions made by the Petitioner, the electricity connection of its unit remained disconnected on account of electricity dues of 1.97 Crores as well as on account of handing over of the possession of the company to the bank due to lack of consensus among the Board of directors of the Company.
- Moreover, the Petitioner has approached the Commission for relief in a matter, which
 is covered under the legislative or regulatory functions of the Commission, wherein

due process of law is to be followed and hence such a relief cannot be granted by way of present adjudicatory proceeding. However, the Commission has taken note of the issue, that has been raised by the Petitioner, and it will be taken up at the time of amendment to other provisions of the Supply Code, 2005.

6. In light of the above, the Petition is hereby dismissed.
