ORDER

1. The Commission vide its earlier Order dated 25.09.2024 allowed the parties request for adjournment of hearing.



2. During the hearing today, Sh. Ajai Vikram Singh, Counsel of the Petitioner submitted that UPPCL raised bill for Rs. 2.5 Cr. (approx.) for the power supplied during the disputed period and in this regard meeting with M.D, UPPCL was held on the previous day wherein it was decided that UPPCL would examine the matter. Sh. Singh requested for another hearing date in the matter. Sh. Bhatt argued that as the prayer is already defunct and therefore, instant matter may be disposed of. However, Counsel for UPPCL Sh. Bhatt argued that the present Petition has become infructuous as claim raised by Petitioner and prayed vide this Petition has already been adjusted in the bill raised by the UPPCL, a fact which is accepted by the Petitioner also.
3. After hearing, the Commission observed that as the Petitioner's prayer for payment of Bills as per CRE Regulations has been adjusted by UPPCL against the claim amount towards energy exported by UPPCL as acknowledged by the Petitioner. Therefore, the prayer raised by Petitioner in the matter has become defunct and accordingly, the Commission decided to dispose the Petition with liberty to file fresh Petition, if required.
4. Further, the Commission expressed its displeasure towards the lackadaisical approach of the UPPCL/PVVNL in energy accounting and settlement of the same. In the instant case, UPPCL took 4 years for energy accounting. Therefore, UPPCL/Discom shall ensure that similar energy accounting issue, if any exist, with any of the generating company is to be settled within 6 months of this Order in accordance with law.

The Petition stands disposed of with liberty to file afresh, if required.
